

Owning a Website

To own a website, you first need to organize two things: 1) a place to store your website (called website hosting), and 2) come up with a unique name for your website (called a domain name). A website hosting business has access to fast Internet computers called 'servers', where for a monthly fee, the hosting business provides you with Internet space in which to build your website. A good website host can also assist you with information on their different hosting features and plans.

For the second requirement—your domain name, select a unique name that reflects the general purpose of your website. For businesses or organizations, the domain name should be as close to your trading name as possible. Try to select a name that no one else already has, to avoid confusion and possible legal proceedings. You must pay a small yearly fee to have your domain name registered.
